





Waiting for the Biblioburro by Monica Brown Pic Brown





Jimmy the Greatest! By Jairo Buitrago Pic Bui





Arroz con Leche / Rice Pudding: Un poema para cocinar / A cooking poem by Jorge Argueta (El Salvador)




The Dream Stealer by Sid Fleischman J Fleischman (Mexico)





Encantado: Pink Dolphin of the Amazon by Sy Montgomery J 599.538 Mon
